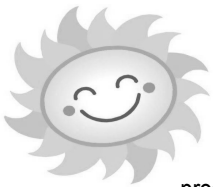

Budget News – In an effort to keep our taxpayers informed about the Library budget vote process, we'd like to remind you of the following:

- All residents of the Greenwood Lake Union Free School District are eligible to vote; **our vote is NOT restricted to Village residents.**
- **The Library budget vote is separate from the school budget vote and is held at the Library.** Your Library tax appears as a **separate** line item on your school tax bill.
- The Library's fiscal year runs from July through June.
- The Library schedules a budget hearing at least ten (10) days prior to the budget vote from 1-3 p.m., which is publicized in *The Warwick Valley Dispatch* and *The Times Herald Record*. Patrons are welcome to come to review the proposed budget on the day of the hearing with Robert Fraser, Treasurer, and Sandy Newman, Assistant Treasurer. For those who are unable to make the hearing, the budget materials will be available for review at the Front Desk. For questions, please call Sandy Newman at Ext. 102.
- The 2012-2013 budget vote is on Thursday, May 17th, 2012, from 2-8 p.m. at the Library.

Winner of "Honorable Mention" for the RCLS 2010 Adult Program of the Year Award

The Greenwood Lake Public Library is proud to announce that its "Healthy Living" series has won Honorable Mention in the Ramapo Catskill Library System's "2010 Adult Program of the Year Award." The Healthy Living series competed against submissions from other libraries within RCLS, which has forty-seven member libraries.

The Healthy Living series was created by Kelly Corrado, Coordinator of Adult Services, Special Programs, Publicity, and Promotions, who creates and supervises all of our adult programming, as well as some family programming. She also created and coordinates our Collectible Series, now in its eleventh year, as well as coordinates the popular Works of Art Gallery and the Budding Artist Gallery. In addition, she's in charge of all Library promotion, including our quarterly newsletter.

In January 2010 our "Healthy Living" series debuted; it was designed to bring informative and timely presentations on a variety of topics on healthy living, which brought adult patrons together for thoughtful discussions. It also offered a variety of things that patrons could do on their own that would help them on a path to a healthier life. The Healthy Living series fulfilled its mission, as well as educated people about the many free outreach programs available in our community. The series will continue because it has not only proven to be a valuable resource and attraction for our adult patrons, but it is also presented mainly through outreach, so it does not have any presenter fees, thus saving our valuable programming dollars for additional offerings. Join us at future Healthy Living programs that will offer a variety of health topics for "healthy living!"

2011 County of Orange Arts Grant

The Greenwood Lake Public Library is proud to announce that we have been awarded a \$5,000 "2011 County of Orange Arts Grant" from Orange County Tourism and the County of Orange to support our "Thursday Nite Music Makers Concert Series" that debuted this fall.

Special congratulations, thanks, and recognition must be given to staff member, Kelly Corrado, our Adult & Special Programs' Supervisor, who not only applied for the grant, but who developed, promoted, and implemented this wonderful new music series of programs for families.

Besides securing this \$5,000 grant, Kelly also secured a grant two years ago, which enabled the Library to bring Dr. Paul Brekke, a Norwegian Solar Physicist, who is an expert on the Aurora Borealis, to the Library to present a fascinating lecture to our patrons as part of our International Celebration series focusing on Scandinavian Cultures. Kelly was successful in applying for a \$2,500 grant from the American Scandinavian Foundation and helped secure the sponsorship of the Norwegian Space Centre to have Dr. Brekke present this program not only to another member library for free, but also to the United States Military Academy at no charge to USMA.
