

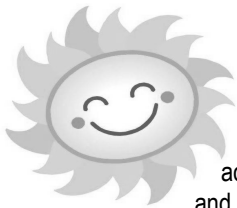

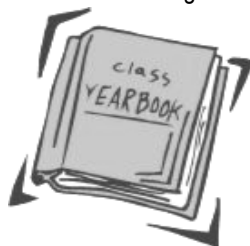
### A Note from the Director,

Winter's here, but don't let the cold weather doldrums get you down! Come visit your Library to find some good reads, movies, and music. Make use of our seven public access computers, Wi-Fi, and museum passes, and be sure not to miss our many entertaining and educational adult, family, children's, and young adult programs!

**Budget News** – In order to keep everyone informed about the Library budget process, we would like to remind all of our patrons of the following:

- The Library budget vote is separate from the school budget vote and **is held at the Library**. Your Library tax appears as a **separate** line item on your school tax bill. The Library's fiscal year runs from July through June.
- All residents of the Greenwood Lake Union Free School District are eligible to vote; **our vote is NOT restricted to Village residents**.
- The Library schedules a budget workshop at least ten (10) days prior to the budget vote from 1-3 p.m., which is publicized in The Warwick Valley Dispatch and the Times Herald Record. Patrons are welcome to come to review the proposed budget on the day of the hearing with Lisa Neyman, Treasurer, and Sandy Newman, Assistant Treasurer. For those who are unable to make the hearing, the budget materials will be available for review at the Front Desk. For questions, please call Sandy Newman at Ext. 12.
- The 2011-2012 budget vote is on Thursday, May 19<sup>th</sup>, 2011, from 2-8 p.m. at the Library.
